Federal judge ruled House can sue Obama administration

A federal judge ruled last week that the House has the right to sue the Obama administration over billions of dollars in health care spending as part of the law's risk sharing programs.

Other highlights include:

- **Alaska's** state Supreme Court declined to block the Medicaid expansion plan implemented by the governor.
- **New Hampshire's** revised network adequacy rules will be in place for January 1, 2018, one year later than planned.
- **Washington** state's Insurance Commissioner has approved 136 individual qualified health plans for Healthplanfinder.
